BLAZON (description in heraldic terms):

Per chevron Gules and Azure, in chief two lions respectant Or charged on the shoulders with a mullet of six points of the second, supporting the tablets of the Law Argent, in base on a grassy mound a tree trunk couped and sprouting six leaved branches proper, and issuing from the apex a sun of the third.

S I G N I F I C A N C E

The Arms of Jacob Hennenberg are divided "per chevron," thus giving the impression of a mountain to the upper portion, and of a roof to the lower portion of the shield. The upper area is red and displays two gold (yellow) lions, charged on the shoulders with six-pointed stars in blue. The lions are facing one another supporting the tablets of the Law in silver (white), and symbolize the founders of the new Hennenberg family, Jacob and his sole heir Michael. The tablets of the Law symbolize their support of the Mosaic Law in the Judaic tradition, and the practice of the law by the immediate heir, Michael Hennenberg.

The lower portion of the shield in blue is charged with a grassy mound upon which grows a cut stump of a tree trunk sprouting six leafy branches. This memorializes the almost total annihilation of the Hennenberg family in 1941, and those brethren who likewise perished in the Holocaust.

Issuing from the apex of the lower division of the shield a golden rayed sun shines forth to give life and warmth to the new family in the United States. The sun also has an immediate symbolism in commemorating this Hennenberg family's settlement in the State of Ohio.

These Arms were assumed on the 4th. day of July, 1976.

The Arms were devised by Anthony W. C. Phelps (member of The Heraldry Society, London, England), Cleveland, Ohio, in cooperation with Jacob and Michael Hennenberg, both of Cleveland, Ohio.

These Arms were filed with the Committee on Heraldry of the New England Historic Genealogical Society, Boston, Mass. on 21st. May, 1977.

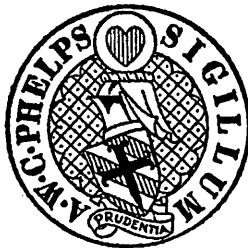
